

s well as the opportunity to hear from someone quite extraordinary, the author talks at RACV Club are intimate events that deepen your connection to the books.


The two books featured this month are entirely different – one a memoir and the other a cookbook – but both authors have interesting life stories and valuable insights to share.

Singer, songwriter, performer, and artist Kate Ceberano's illustrated memoir, *Unsung*, celebrates 40 years of song writing and recording and features song lyrics, stories, paintings and embroidery.

Northern Books' co-owner and Marketing Manager Kristin Gill says Kate is a "loud and proud" Melburnian who's willing to talk honestly about the challenges she's faced, both professionally and personally. "She reinvented herself as an artist during COVID, and this book is about her courage and creativity," Kristin says. "And it's about Kate; it's honest and authentic, and that's exactly who she is."

Kristin says the event later in the month with Amber Guinness will appeal to members who love food-related events, like the upcoming Four Chef Showdown sequel or the Donna Hay talk last year.

"Amber is so warm and engaging and this book is beautiful," Kristin says. "It's about food and travel, and if you can't be on the Amalfi Coast

or in northern Sicily, you can live vicariously through the stories and recipes and photos in her book."

Kristin, who has more than 30 years' experience in the publishing sector, says being in the same room as someone you admire or whose writing you admire can be a fulfilling experience. "Finding out why the book was written, the inspiration behind the characters or story, and the anecdotes along the way; everyone loves those insights, and when an author reads from their book it brings that book to life," she says,

March 14-17: Round 1

can learn how to play golf or practise without feeling pressured. "That's where we hold the lessons for kids and for many of them it's the first time they've held a golf club," he says.


"They learn the basics of the game and how to hit a ball, and those who participated during the summer school holidays had a great time." The ProShop provides junior equipment for the lessons.

n an ever-evolving world, travel trends can guide us towards new horizons and unforgettable experiences. Whether it's cruising through Oceania's pristine waters, exploring the Canadian Rockies, enjoying the cultural riches of Italy, or taking a leisurely jaunt through Vietnam or Japan, these are some of the travel trends worth following.

LEISURELY ADVENTURES

Cruising has long been a favourite pastime for Club members seeking luxury, comfort, and exploration all rolled into one.

Cruising around Australia and the South
Pacific has emerged as a particularly popular
trend in recent times, with experiences as
diverse as visiting tropical islands, seeing New
Zealand's dramatic fjords, and discovering the gems
of Australia's Top End and Kimberley region.

In contrast, European river cruises are favoured by those who love seeing stunning landscapes and historical towns at a leisurely pace. Great rivers to roam include the Danube, Rhine, and Seine.

RUGGED WILDERNESS AND MUSEUMS

For nature lovers and outdoor enthusiasts, the rugged wilderness of the Canadian Rockies and Alaska is an irresistible draw. Home to towering mountains, sparkling glaciers, and abundant wildlife, these pristine

regions invite adventure and exploration. Canada's four distinct seasons offer activities year-round.

Banff and Jasper top the list of Canada's 46 national parks, with hiking and cruising the most popular ways to soak up the scenery.

Lake Louise and Moraine Lake are considered two of the world's most beautiful lakes, while Icefields Parkway is one of the world's most spectacular driving routes.

Don't forget the museums and indigenous cultural experiences. There's the Royal Ontario Museum in Toronto, the Canadian Museum of History in Ottawa, and the vibrant indigenous art scene in British Columbia.

Alaska distinguishes itself by its epic proportions: it has Mendenhall, the largest glacier outside Antarctica, and Denali, America's tallest peak, as well as the largest grizzly bear population in North America - with a guided tour at Katmai National Park & Preserve being one of the best - and safest ways - to view them.

ART HISTORY AND WORLD-CLASS WINES

For travellers with a passion for culture, history, and gastronomy, Italy is a perennial favourite. While some popular destinations within Italy can become packed with tourists during the peak season of summer, the country's allure extends far beyond its well-trodden paths.

Small-group tours are one way to savour regional cuisine and explore hidden corners of Italy's cities and countryside, including the medieval hills of Tuscany, the beautiful Amalfi Coast, and the tranquil Italian Lakes.

ANCIENT TEMPLES AND VIBRANT STREET MARKETS

Travellers are drawn to Vietnam's rich cultural heritage, breathtaking natural beauty, and



delicious cuisine. This country of nearly 100 million people boasts a long and storied history, reflected in its ancient temples, colonial architecture, and UNESCO

preference. Vietnamese people are also renowned for their hospitality, and compared to many other travel destinations, Vietnam offers excellent value for money.




TRADITIONAL CHARM AND FUTURISTIC APPEAL

RECIPROCAL CLUB

Barcelona is a hub of food, fashion and cuisine, with lots of special events and festivals throughout the year. But did you know it's also the location of one of RACV Club's most charming reciprocal clubs?

Círculo Ecuestre was founded more than 160 years ago, in 1856, by a group of horseriding enthusiasts, and the club then became a meeting place for politicians and leading figures in Catalonian society.

Today it offers RACV Club Members a central place to stay in Barcelona, although, with only 12 double bedrooms, there is limited availability. Even if you stay somewhere else in this Mediterranean city, it's worth visiting Círculo Ecuestre for a meal or a drink at the bar. The club is housed in a Modernist urban palace, which, like Antoni Gaudi's Sagrada Familia, has some unique architectural elements. Original features from the beginning of the 20th century include a marble staircase, Venetian mirrors, and Murano glass chandeliers.

Among the many reasons to visit Barcelona this year include the 2024 Spanish Grand Prix in June, the Louis Vuitton 37th America's Cup Barcelona from August to October, and the 48H Open House Festival when more than 100 buildings open their doors in October.

NB: Círculo Ecuestre closes for three weeks in August every year.


