
We also feature a spectacular new visual art exhibition in the Gallery Lounge (on page 14) and focus on family ties in our much-loved member interest groups (see page 12).

Early bookings are recommended for these and all events on the Club calendar. As always, we look forward to welcoming members and their guests at RACV Club.







The evening's theme, Normandy, pays homage to Philippe's origins. Envision a classic French ambience: warm, inviting and moody, with vibrant touches of French culture and music, evoking the charm of a seaside market.

These include his eponymous restaurant in Collins Street, where we meet to discuss the tantalising albeit serious business of what members can expect to savour at the Healesville signature dinner event.

The flavours of Normandy will be in their element. "We will have cider, Calvados and most likely a duck dish, probably garnished with apple," Philippe says. "Of course, there will be typical cheeses such as Livarot and Camembert, a fish dish and Normandy cream."



In fact, a specialty dessert is expected to comprise the key Normandy ingredients of apple and cream flavoured with almonds.

A breathtaking new exhibition brings together the artworks of a celebrated trio of Australian artists who use colour to explore formal, physical and psychological realms.

and presented in collaboration with independent gallery Sarah Scout Presents, showcases three celebrated artists — Nadine Christensen, Greg Creek and Anna Finlayson — who invite us to see the world not just as it is, but as it feels, dreams and remembers. Through bold colour palettes and a blend of visual languages, these artists delve into the formal, physical and psychological terrains that define our experience of place and self.

Christensen's
layered

compositions apply elements of collage and colour shifts to suggest fleeting urban moments and ephemeral thoughts. Creek blends fragmented domestic and industrial spaces with speculative fiction to create allegories about contemporary life. Finlayson, meanwhile, works with delicate watercolours and graphic forms, creating an exploration of colour that is both whimsical and reflective.

Together, these artists span a wide visual spectrum, from representation to abstraction, a painted gesture to careful observation. Yet they're united by a shared desire to map the intangible: the sensations, dreams, and subtle cues that shape our interactions with the world. Whether you're drawn to the cerebral, the sensory, or the surreal, this exhibition offers the chance to step inside a world where boundaries dissolve and dreamscapes take the lead.



ere are some of the best ways to have an idyllic tropical holiday there and better yet, RACV members can enjoy special offers and discounts at local attractions, too.

WHITEHAVEN BEACH

The Whitsundays are located along Queensland's central coast, just over 1,100km north of Brisbane and 55 kilometres out into the Coral Sea.

The largest island is Whitsunday Island, home to the seven-kilometre-long Whitehaven Beach. Despite almost year-round sunshine, the silica composition of the sand remains cool to touch for bare feet. The water, however, is warm.

There are plenty of ways to get there, too, from scenic helicopter flights that land on the beach, to yachts and ferries, many departing from Airlie Beach.

HAMILTON ISLAND

The largest inhabited island within the Whitsundays, Hamilton Island is not only a quintessential tropical island paradise, but the gateway to the Great Barrier Reef and an ideal base to explore the region via seaplanes, helicopters or yachts.

Hamilton Island also has plenty of accommodation and activity options. Relax by a pool, indulge in spa treatments, dine at bars and restaurants or play 18 holes at Hamilton Island Golf Club.

THE HEART REEF


As equally iconic as Whitehaven, and near to it, is the Heart Reef, a collection of coral that has, to the delight of romantics everywhere, naturally formed into the shape of a heart.

Given its popularity with sightseers, it's protected, so you can't dive or snorkel there. However, it's best viewed from above anyway.

Scenic flights, on helicopters, light planes or sea planes, depart from Airlie Beach, Whitsunday Coast Airport and Hamilton and Daydream Islands.

HARDY REEF

Heart Reef is nestled within a lagoon that's part of the bigger Hardy Reef, where you can get in the water with the incredible coral and amazing marine life and stay overnight.



Moored 39 nautical miles from the mainland, the recently refurbished Reefworld is a pontoon that provides ways to experience the reef from a different angle.

Reefworld is also home to the reef's first underwater hotel. Their 'Reefsuites' are located below sea level with massive windows to observe dazzling marine life.

AIRLIE BEACH

Your mainland base for all things Whitsundays is Airlie Beach, given the multitude of day trips and tour packages departing from here.

With its own palm-lined beaches and small population, it has a relaxed coastal village feel, with Airlie Beach Lagoon a highlight.

Now's the time to escape the southern winter and bask in the glow of a Whitsundays Island holiday.
