

TEST THEIR METTLE

Opposing cricket giants ignite the infamous Australian/English rivalry for the famous urn at our blockbuster Ashes cricket luncheon.



he Ashes series between Australia and England is more than a battle for national supremacy. Collective pride is also on the line.

Let the contest begin with the Ashes-inspired Annual Cricket Luncheon on Friday 14 November from 12pm to 3pm at Level 17, City Club.

This year's event brings together two of the most respected leaders in Ashes history, Michael Vaughan and Mark Taylor.

The former England and Australia captains know more than most about the exhilarating highs and demoralising lows of an Ashes series.

Vaughan was awarded an OBE for ending a generation of English pain in the 2005 series. He made his mark in the 2002-2003 series in Australia, scoring three centuries on his way to becoming the first cricketer on the cover of *Wisden*.

Taylor, the left-handed opener, starred in the 1989 series in "possibly one of the worst sides to ever tour England". He amassed 839 runs at 83.9, including two tons, to help regain the Ashes 4-0 for the first time since 1982-83.

The highs of 1989 contrasted with a batting slump in 1990-91, then peaked again in 1993 in the 4-1 win before captaining series wins in 1994-95 and 1997.

Executive Chef Kyle Doody (pictured below, far right) says the Brits vs the Baggy Greens menu will highlight the best produce of both countries, from Suffolk lamb, Spencer Gulf kingfish to Gippsland dairy-cow beef.

Then there's our iconic barramundi that many an English angler has travelled for — just to get one on the hook and tell the story back in the pub in Blighty about how it almost dragged them into the 'drink'!

Of course, it wouldn't be the RACV Club cricket luncheon without a little menu sledging and tongue-in-cheek references.

"The menu is full of monumental moments in Australian and English cricket history, lovingly told on the plate. Think posh fish and chips retold vs a finger-raised golden duck (four-and-out) 20 pie!

"The great Kerry O'Keeffe, or 'Skull,' as he is affectionately known, gets a spot on our menu with 'Skull' island prawns — what's more iconic than a prawn on the barbie, a frothy or two and the cricket on the wireless?

"As a bonified cricket nuffy, I can't wait," Kyle says.

Based on creating a sense of ownership and elevating the member experience, the locker system also provides a practical way of storing favourites from their collection on site.

Nicolas Denino, Food and Beverage Supervisor at Wine Bar, Bourke Street Green and Carbine Bar, says "the Wine Bar locker system is also about deepening members' connection to the venue."

The lockers have become one of Wine Bar's most talkedabout features — offering members a personalised and premium experience.

Due to popular demand globally and growing interest locally, the locker system was introduced at RACV Club amid the uncertainty of Victoria's first Covid-19 lockdown (in March 2020). The timing and immediate popularity served to enhance member engagement and create unique value.

Nic believes the locker system captures such strong member interest due to its rarefied, Club-like component.

"Members love the sense of exclusivity, convenience and the ability to share their favourite bottles in a personalised setting," he says. "It adds a layer of sophistication and belonging that resonates with our clientele."

The chosen few, about 60 Club members, have lockers — with nine vacancies available. Once those vacancies are filled, a waitlist system begins.

How can members secure a locker, and what are the costs and inclusions?

Locker retention is based on per-bottle pricing from a curated spirit list.

"If you purchase a basic bottle, it will secure your locker for six months. Whereas, if you purchase a limited or rare-spirit bottle, it will secure your locker for 12 months," Nic says.

"This includes a personalised nameplate for the locker and a smaller nameplate for your key rings, access to limited releases that have been added to the spirit bottle list and exclusive tasting events."

What a perfect Christmas gift for the wine-and-spirit connoisseur in your life.
