My team and I were delighted to host several member information sessions at the City and Healesville properties last month, and it was wonderful to meet members in person and hear their stories and receive their helpful feedback.

This year, RACV Club has held many great events, launched new initiatives and celebrated awards. The awards included the Australian Bridal Industry Academy's Best Club Reception for Healesville, and two Victorian Accommodation Awards for Excellence: Superior Accommodation of the Year for City Club and Regional Hotel Restaurant of the Year for Banyalla. Who's up for some haggis, neeps and tatties - and a wee dram? Expect some fine Scottish fare and whisky at our inaugural Robert Burns dining event

WHO WAS ROBERT BURNS?

Robert Burns was an 18th century Scottish poet and lyricist. A pioneer of the Romantic movement, his work inspired liberal and socialist movements throughout Europe. He has become a cultural icon in Scotland, and his work is still celebrated today by Scottish descendants and ex-patriots around the world, including Australia.

WHAT IS HIS BEST-KNOWN POEM?

Burns has several famous poems, most written in 'light Ascots dialect'. *Auld Lang Syne* is the most notable, often sung at Hogmany (New Year's Eve). His poem *Scots Wha Hae* is the unofficial national anthem of Scotland. His *Ode to the Haggis* honours the famous Scottish dish.

WHY DOES HIS WORK RESONATE TODAY?

Burns's engagement with the human condition imbues a timelessness into his writing. His themes of love and nature, the latter within the context of the Industrial Revolution, have always had broad appeal.

WHAT INSPIRED THIS DINING EVENT?

The Club has many Scottish members, or members with Scottish heritage, and many have expressed interest in attending a Scottish-themed event at the Club. The Club previously had an annual St Andrews Day event at Healesville, which was always well attended.

WHATIS HAGGIS?

Haggis is like a crumbly sausage, with a coarse oaty texture and a peppery flavour. It's often served with neeps (mashed turnip) and tatties (mashed potato) and washed down with a wee dram of whisky.



Don't be surprised if the Robert Burns dinner puts you in the mood for a special dinner on St Valentine's Day. After all, one of Burns' best known poems is *My Love is Like a Red, Red Rose*.

Summer is a great time for scenic rides, and exploring new places, so why not incorporate cycling into a stay at City Club or Healesville for an enriching experience?

hether you're a seasoned cyclist or a casual rider, Melbourne has lots of well-designed bike trails that offer an enjoyable way to explore the city.

January, in particular, is one of the best times to ride a bike around inner Melbourne, with fewer cars on the road during the school holidays.

Rather than driving to City Club, you could consider cycling from the suburbs or catch a V/Line train from a regional area. Melbourne's bike-friendly infrastructure and relatively flat terrain makes it accessible to riders of all fitness levels, providing an enjoyable and efficient workout. Club Members can take advantage of City Club's Mobility Hub and store their bikes safely while dining or staying in-house at the Club.

If you're nervous about cycling around the city, it's easy to dismount and wheel your bike to a designated bike path or somewhere where you feel safe to carry on your journey.

At Healesville Country Club & Resort, bicycles are available free of charge to use around the Club and to cycle into Healesville village. That's one of the many family friendly things you can do at the Club.

So, what are you waiting for? Grab your helmet, pump up those tires, and embark on a two-wheeled adventure, using the Club as your base.

TOP BIKE TRAILS

NEAR CITY CLUB

Capital City Trail: This iconic trail loops around the heart of Melbourne, taking riders on a 29km journey through parks, gardens, and waterfronts. It's a perfect way to see the city's landmarks at a leisurely pace.

Beach Road: For those seeking a coastal experience, Beach Road is a must-try. Stretching along Port Phillip Bay, this route provides views of the bay, and the flat terrain makes it suitable for riders of all skill levels.





NEAR HEALESVILLE COUNTRY CLUB & RESORT

Healesville: Bicycles are available free of charge to use around the Club grounds and cycle into Healesville village. Nearby Queens Park is a safe place for children to do laps, with bumps and obstacles to make it fun, and it's great for scooters too.

Lilydale to Warburton Rail Trail: This trail passes through picturesque landscapes and is suited to a wide range of cyclists. At 40km in length, it can be done in sections, such as the 2.4km cycle from Launching Place to Yarra Junction.

O'Shannassy Aqueduct Rail West Loop, Warburton: For the intermediate mountain bike rider, this 30km trail promises a mix of flat, open areas and steep roads that will get your heart pumping. A relaxing spa and sauna back at the Club is recommended after this one.

urope in winter is magical. Scandinavian countries like Norway,
Sweden and Finland transform into dazzling, snow-covered
wonderlands, with the Aurora Borealis dancing in the night skies of
the Arctic, making a camera essential for any tour.

In central Europe, Christmas markets steeped in local history and culture come to life with festive lights, carols and traditional foods.

If you're after a white Christmas, the further north and further inland you go in Europe, the higher your chance of seeing snow. If you grew up singing *Rudolph*, *the Red-Nosed Reindeer*, then a visit to a reindeer farm will make that tradition meaningful. Here, you can take a gentle reindeer sleigh ride, feed the reindeer, and learn about the Sámi people, who are the Indigenous people of the northern part of the Scandinavian Peninsula.

For the adventurous, you'll find tours that include husky sledding and snowmobile safaris, while <u>APT's 22-day tour</u> has a more leisurely approach, with a visit to Arktikum science museum in Rovaniemi and a guided exploration of Helsinki's architecture, including Oodi Library and the Opera House.

MAGICAL CHRISTMAS MARKETS

For a fairy-tale experience, consider a tour that explores Central Europe's festive markets. Held annually in November, December and sometimes early January, Christmas markets are a popular attraction in Germany, Austria and many European countries.
